**Jeff Mousseau Named President and General Manager
of Bechtel BWXT Idaho**

IDAHO FALLS, IDAHO (November 7, 2007)---Jeff Mousseau has been named President and General Manager of Bechtel BWXT Idaho, succeeding Paul Divjak, Bechtel National Inc. President David Walker announced today.

Mr. Divjak has been asked to lead Bechtel Jacobs Company, the environmental management contractor for the U.S. Department of Energy's Oak Ridge Office, located in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The transition from Mr. Divjak to Mr. Mousseau will take place during November, with Mr. Mousseau assuming full responsibilities on Dec. 1.

Prior to his selection as president, Mr. Mousseau served as Vice President and Plant Manager of the Advanced Mixed Waste Treatment Project, located at the Department of Energy's Idaho site. Bechtel BWXT Idaho manages and operates AMWTP for the Department.

"Jeff has demonstrated excellent leadership skills and combined with his dedication, discipline and knowledge of operations unique to the Advanced Mixed Waste Treatment Project he has a solid foundation for assuming this new position," said Mr. Walker.

In addition to his responsibilities as Vice President and Plant Manager, Mr. Mousseau led the Waste Programs work at AMWTP that is responsible for validating the types and amounts of waste that are safely and compliantly shipped out of Idaho. As both Plant Manager and Waste Programs Manager, Mr. Mousseau has consistently and successfully worked with DOE customers in Idaho and at the Carlsbad Operations Site that oversees operations of the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant where the nation's transuranic waste is stored.

The change of leadership has been discussed with officials at Department of Energy Headquarters and DOE's Idaho Operations Office. "The Department is nearly three years ahead of the Idaho Settlement Agreement for shipping transuranic waste out of the state," said DOE Idaho Operations Deputy Manager Rick Provencher. "Waste from the Idaho site accounts for over 40 percent of all waste disposed at WIPP, more than any other Department site. We look forward to working with Jeff Mousseau, Vice President and Deputy General Manager Scott Raish, and the rest of the team in maintaining this successful performance."

Mr. Mousseau has worked at the Department of Energy's Idaho site for more than 15 years. A graduate of the University of Idaho, Mr. Mousseau is a licensed professional engineer in the state of Idaho and is a native of Idaho Falls.
